Lottery Tickets Aren't Child's Play" responsible gaming campaign led by the National Council of Problem Gambling. In her new position, Schaefer will lead Scientific Games' proactive strategy to further promote responsible gaming in its lottery business. Schaefer will work closely with all Scientific Games teams to leverage data and predictive analytics to implement programs and develop products and programs for the Lottery's customers that help raise awareness for and mitigate potential problem gaming before it becomes an issue for any player.

"Social responsibility and integrity are cornerstones of Scientific Games, and we are extremely proud to stand with our lottery customers and the National Council on Problem Gaming in maintaining responsible play throughout the Lottery industry," said Schaefer. "Lottery games are created to entertain, and intended to be played by adults.
